We had a busy, busy summer in the Children's Room of the Chico Branch Library! Around 800 children signed-up for the Summer Library Program and about a thousand youths attended a variety of summer activities offered at the Chico Branch Library.

Bugs and more bugs greeted library users as they entered the Children's Room during the summer months. Library staff and volunteers from the National Charity League delighted children with their buggy creations that hung from the ceiling. Wonderful realistic insect stickers were applied to the floor and the trail led the way to the (what else!) books on bugs!

Highlights from the summer included a marionette show performed by Fratello Marionettes; a visiting alligator, lemur and bear cub who were with a wild life education program called Wild Things Inc.; a summer reading celebration with a concert on the lawn; a puppet workshop; stories in Japanese; and original story times and crafts.

The library would like to thank the Teen Library Volunteers as well as the Library Club (9-14 years) for lending a hand this summer with the Summer Library Program.
