## STABLE FUNDING SOUGHT FOR BUTTE COUNTY LIBRARIES

The County Board of Supervisors finalized (for now) the 2009-10 budget, which included reductions in library hours and support. Further reductions came from the City of Chico and county funds may be reduced later this year as fewer state funds are made available to counties.

With these reductions and budget fluctuations there have been several meetings and much discussion among library supporters about how to achieve the goal of stable funding for our library system. One long-discussed option is to go to the voters to ask for voter approval of some kind of a tax measure which would provide dedicated funding for the library.

A group of interested people have been meeting to research information about what might be included in possible ballot measures, when to place a measure before voters, and how such a ballot measure might be received by voters. As proposals are brought forward, we will look for all library supporters to get involved.

#### "SOROPTIMISTS STEP UP"

Ever great supporters of the Chico library, the Soroptimists have once again voted to extend a helping hand in support of the library during these fiscally troubling times. A gift of \$20,000 will be coming to the Friends to be distributed as follows: \$14,000 for extra personnel and \$6,000 for computer upgrades.

In the past the Soroptimists have been generous in their giving to the library several times. Examples include when the library was threatened to be closed on Saturdays a few years back, they provided the money to keep it open. They also were responsible for a large gift to revamp the Children's Room five years ago.

The CFOL as well as the citizens of Chico are indebted to their generosity and owe them big thanks. If you know any woman who is a member of the Soroptimists, please give them a personal thank you.

#### **CFOL CONTRIBUTES**

The Chico Friends of the Library has for the past several months contracted with librarian Nancy Leek to work in the Children's Room of the Chico branch library three hours per week. Two of these hours are for Story Times, with the final hour serving the needs of children and parents who require reference help. The Board voted this past summer to extend that contract with Nancy for the fiscal year 2009-10.

The Board of the CFOL also voted at its August meeting to give Susan Rauen, Chico branch librarian, sixteen hours of extra help per week at a cost of \$12,064 per year.
